## Hawaii Teachers Receive Free Museum Admissions And Teaching Materials January 5 and 6, 2009 At Pacific Aviation Museum Pearl Harbor

Hawaii teachers are invited to visit the newest of the Pearl Harbor Historic Sites, Pacific Aviation Museum Pearl Harbor on historic Ford Island, compliments of the Museum's Education Department, Monday and Tuesday, January 5 and 6, 2009. Teachers will also receive free Museum *HCPS III Aligned* Education Program packets for use in their classrooms. According to Education Director KT Budde-Jones, the Museum's complimentary program for teachers is intended "to make teaching Hawaii's unique history just 'plane' fun."

For tickets, teachers should present their current school ID at the USS Bowfin Submarine Park Ticket Office near the Arizona Memorial office and board the shuttle bus to Ford Island. Family and friends may join at the kama`aina rate of \$10 adult; \$5, children. The Museum is open 9AM to 5PM daily. Pacific Aviation Museum Pearl Harbor occupies World War II-era hangars that still bear the scars of our nation's first aviation battlefield. It features rare aircraft such as a 1941 Japanese Zero, an F4F Wildcat, and a B-25 Mitchell bomber, similar to the one Jimmy Doolittle made famous during his 1942 raid "30 Seconds Over Tokyo." Other attractions include combat flight simulators, an aviation-themed Museum Store and dining at Laniākea Café. The Museum is located in Hangars 37 and 79, Ford Island, 319 Lexington Boulevard, Pearl Harbor.
